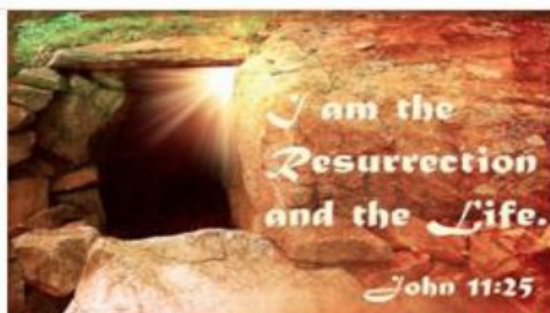

Easter, which celebrates Jesus Christ's resurrection from the dead, is Christianity's most important holiday.

It has been called a moveable feast because it doesn't fall on a set date every year, as most holidays do.

Christian churches in the West celebrate Easter on the first Sunday following the full moon after the vernal equinox on March 21st.

An equinox is an astronomical event which occurs twice each year, around March 20th and September 23rd.

On an equinox, day and night are of approximately equal duration all over the planet.

Therefore, Easter is observed anywhere between March 22nd and April 25th every year.

Orthodox Christians use the Julian calendar to calculate when Easter will occur and typically celebrate the holiday a week or two after the Western churches, which follow the Gregorian calendar.

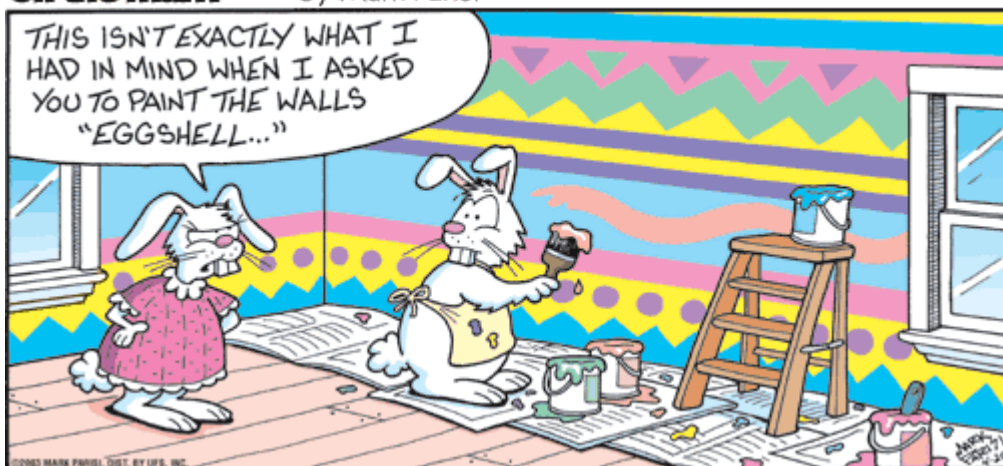
